

## **UCA grading system versus ECTS grading scale**

<b>ECTS Scale</b>	<b>Definition</b>	<b>Percentage of successful students normally achieving the grade</b>	<b>UCA Grades Equivalents</b>
<b>A</b>	<b>EXCELLENT - outstanding performance with only minor errors</b>	<b>0,27 %</b>	<b>16 to 20</b>
<b>B</b>	<b>VERY GOOD - above the average standard but with some errors</b>	<b>4,16 %</b>	<b>14 to 15,99</b>
<b>C</b>	<b>GOOD - generally sound work with a number of notable errors</b>	<b>14 %</b>	<b>13 to 13,99</b>
<b>D</b>	<b>SATISFACTORY- fair but with significant shortcomings</b>	<b>37,67 %</b>	<b>11 to 12,99</b>
<b>E</b>	<b>SUFFICIENT - performance meets the minimum criteria</b>	<b>15,30 %</b>	<b>10 to 10,99</b>
<b>FX</b>	<b>FAIL - some more work required before the credit can be awarded</b>	<b>7,78 %</b>	<b>8 to 9,99</b>
<b>F</b>	<b>FAIL - considerable further work is required</b>	<b>20,82 %</b>	<b>0 to 7,99</b>
